Cat Tails was started in 2004. In early 2005 a bunch of volunteers began working to convert a former real estate office in Ocean Isle Beach into a home for Cat Tails. We opened our facility in April 2005 with 8 cats and one litter of 7 born during the construction! Since then we have adopted out almost 8300 cats and kittens. Much of this success is due to our volunteers. There is a lot of cleaning, feeding, and scooping to be done. Much is also due to our loyal supporters. No one on our staff is paid, but it still takes money to buy food and kitty litter and take care of the cats. We're all working together to make a better life for the cats and the people who adopt them. Thank you everyone who has helped make our first 19 years successful! Let's hope for a strong finish to our second decade in business!
